CHRIST IS BORN! GLORIFY HIM!

Dear Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this glorious Feast of the Nativity of Christ we celebrate a truly wondrous event in which God, in His infinite and marvelous grace, became man bringing us enduring hope, newness of life, and eternal salvation. The Son of God, the Lord of Glory and King of Kings who upholds the universe by His word of power, became man so that we human beings might be redeemed, renewed, united with Him, and become fellow citizens with the Saints and members of God's kingdom.

The magnitude and depth of the event of the Nativity of Christ are impossible to grasp, but the message is clear and true. It is a message of grace, hope, and salvation to all humanity and to all the created order. It is a message which we both celebrate and share on this sacred day, an invitation to "come and see" what our loving Creator and God has done for us.

On the night of the Nativity, the angels appeared in the glory of God and announced the birth of Christ to the Shepherds. In response they said, "Let us go...and see this thing that has happened." Christmas Pastoral Letter

January 7, 2022

Dear St. Nicholas Faithful & Friends,

Christ is Born! Glorify Him! Christos Raždajetsja! Slavite Jeho!

A child, newly-born, is comforted by a single act: swaddling. To do this, a mother and a father take a cloth, lay the child onto it, and fold it tightly around them until it is so tight, the child feels as though they have returned to their mother's womb. You will notice in the icon of the Nativity, the Christ Child is swaddled tightly. However, in particular icons, it doesn't look like a simple cloth; it looks more like a burial shroud, like a white bandage wrapped all around Himself. This is a foreshadowing of what would happen to Him, that He came in order to surrender His life.





There is another icon, balanced in almost exactly the same way: the Dormition of the Mother of God. In the icon of her death, she is laid out peacefully and, above her, her Son is holding what appears to be the same child: small, swaddled tightly in a white bandage; this time, the child is Mary, newly-born to eternity. At her death, Jesus Christ receives personally the soul of the one who received Him. This is an icon of our own destiny, that Jesus Christ was Born to this life in order that we, like Mary, might be born to eternal life, comforted as though it were our mother's womb.

Thank you to one and all, the Church officers, the Board of Trustees, the St. Nicholas Altar Society, and all St. Nicholas Faithful & Friends, for your continued love, sacrifice, & endurance as we join in celebration once again in our true purpose: the worship of our newly-Incarnate Lord. Let us glorify Him!


